

## PASTOR MATT'S JANUARY 2021 MESSAGE

Happy New Year! Thank God 2020 is over! What a year it was. The whirlwind of the pandemic, racial tensions and election year politics was overwhelming. So much tragedy, hardship and division. We look forward to 2021 if nothing else than to escape 2020. Certainly, with the distribution of new vaccines having begun, there is already reason for great hope for 2021. We all want to go back to normal.

As much as we want to escape 2020 and go back to normal, we are not out of the woods yet. As the transition of power to a new president happens, we are divided as ever. We are facing the darkest days of the pandemic before the vaccines can turn the tide. It doesn't seem like 2020 will go away silently into the night. Many of our societal problems, that the pandemic has exacerbated, have been long in the making. There may be no going back to normal but a seeking out of a new normal. It is a scary time.

We as Christians do not need to be afraid. Yes, we will be scared but we don't *need* to be scared. We do not need to fear death. We do not need to fear change. The very heart of our faith is the promise of the resurrection from death to new life. There is no bigger change than this. This season of Epiphany that we enter is about the celebrating of, with the birth of Jesus, and how the light of God's love enters our lives. When the light of that love enters our lives, it casts away the darkness and everything in us is revealed. Everything good and bad is revealed. This can be very uncomfortable. It is a human tendency to want God to love just the good in us and to conveniently ignore the bad. The problem with this kind of love is that it provides little comfort or nourishment. Our deepest hurts and needs are always located near the bad stuff. If the bad stuff stays hidden in the dark it is never lovingly healed. In our tendency to hide from our short comings, we are quick to point out the short comings of others. The peace the angels sing of at Jesus's birth happens when the light of God's love reveals the short comings of us and our neighbor that we might find forgiveness and reconciliation.

We need the wisdom of Epiphany in our society if we are to bridge our differences and forge a better world in 2021. The process of reconciliation with God and with one another that Epiphany shows by revealing the good and bad in all of us is both bold and humbling. It requires courage and faith. It is counter cultural. It is so much easier to pray that God punish our enemies and convince them that we are right without us having to change how we might be wrong. We all have the tendency to run from the light, even the light of God's love. Often it takes someone to be the first one to step into the light, to be revealed, to be vulnerable, before others will have the courage to do the same. We change the world when we do this with one person at a time in our lives.

Let us whole heartedly declare, "Happy New Year" this year. As we do so, let us boldly and humble step into the light of God's love to change this world for the better. Happy New Year.


## Bible Study for Kids God's Plan for Us

It's a new year! We look forward to new things! There is one thing that never changes, and that's God's love for us. God has a direction and a plan for your life. All it takes is a willing heart to follow his lead.



To do what is right, we must know what is right. It is the **Bible** that defines what is good according to God. We should study the Scriptures, asking God to give us such wisdom and insight, so that we might walk in His ways.

God knows where we are, how far off the path we are, and what it takes to get us there, and God will listen when we ask for help. He'll always be there to help us find our way.



In the book of **Micah**, Micah's message is for all times and for all people: As God's people, we should do what is right, be merciful to others just as God is merciful to us. We should walk in step with God and reflect his ways. "The Lord will bring me into the light, and I will see his righteousness." Micah's prophecies remind us that God demands justice, humility, sincerity and love from his people.

In **Judges 2:1**, the angel of the Lord told God's people, the Israelites, "I brought you out of Egypt into this land that I swore to give your ancestors, and I said I would never break my covenant with you." After this, the people still disobeyed the Lord by forgetting all of the good things he had done for them and by disobeying him and worshiping false gods. But God rescued his people when they prayed to him for help.

**Isaiah** was a prophet who foretold the coming of the Messiah, to be sent by God. God would bring salvation to those who would trust in him and have faith in him. Isaiah looked toward the future to teach others about God's plan. Indeed, God sent us Jesus, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas.

In **Matthew 5:17-19**, Jesus tells his followers: "Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets . . . until heaven and earth disappear, not even the smallest detail of God's law will disappear until its purpose is achieved."

As Paul wrote in **Colossians 3**, "So, as those who have been chosen of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience; bearing with one another, and forgiving each other, whoever has a complaint against anyone; just as the Lord forgave you, so also should you. Beyond all these things put on love, which is the perfect bond of unity."


## THANK YOU FOR YOUR OFFERINGS!
