Outdoor Worship Instructions: For Easter worship at the church we will have “drive though” style and outdoor on the lawn style worship. For “drive through” style you stay in your vehicle at the church. To hear the service you can tune in on your FM radio or view the live stream on Facebook. For outdoor style worship social distancing boxes will be marked on the church lawn near the parking lot, for you to place a folding chair and sit. The worship team will have a sound system set up outside for leading worship. If the weather is too cold or the ground is too wet, worship at the church will be “drive though” style only. This determination will be made after assessing conditions at church the morning of the service and will we let you know upon your arrival at the church.

- Bring to the church a folding chair for everyone in your household
- After parking at the church, wear a mask existing your vehicle, bringing your chairs.
- An usher will direct you toward a social distancing box.
- On your way toward your box or after you have placed your chairs at your box, on Palm Sunday pick up a palm and on Easter pick up a communion single serve kit. You may leave your offering in the plate provided at this time. If you have chosen to stay in you vehicle, an usher will bring you palms or communion kits. An usher will also bring a plate to collect your offering at this time. Please wear your mask for all interactions with the ushers.
- Once at your social distancing box, please keep you mask on for all singing.
- After the service has concluded please wear your mask, maintain social distancing and limit interactions with others as you make your way back to your vehicle.
- If you have not done so already, you may leave you offering in the plate provided on your way back to your vehicle.

The Holy Spirit Lives in Us



What a marvelous, awesome event Jesus' loved ones and disciples experienced when they witnessed his resurrection! When they first saw him alive again, some did not realize at first that he actually was Jesus!

Jesus spoke to the disciples as God's son when he said,

"Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."

And with that he breathed on them and said,

"Receive the Holy Spirit." (John 20:21-22)







Peter told them that God would pour out his spirit on all people and promised them that "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (Acts 2:21)

". . . God had raised Jesus from the dead . . . "because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him." (Acts 2:24)

The people asked Peter and the other apostles, "What shall we do?" (Acts 2:37) Peter answered, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off – for all whom the Lord our God will call." (Acts 2:38-39) "Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day." (Acts 2:41)

Just like those people in the crowd, we have received God's gift of the Holy Spirit in baptism.

When we sin, we must ask for forgiveness from others and from God.

That is our responsibility as Christians. We express these thoughts to God in prayer.

He knows our true intentions and wants us to turn to him for guidance each day. He surrounds us with his gift of the Holy Spirit to give us purpose – to reach out to others and share his love, which is like no other!


