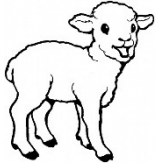

## **Kids' Bible Lesson** **Jesus, the Lamb of God**

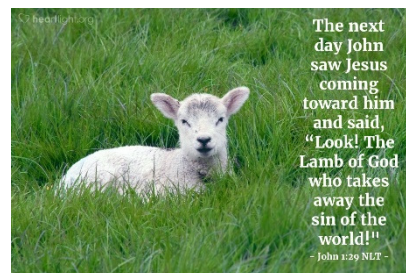
John 1: 32-34

We are thankful for being able to return to in-person, in-sanctuary worship services and thank everyone for their financial support. For year-to-date through April, our expenses have exceeded our regular revenue by \$20,094. Fortunately, Advent was also the recipient of a Small Business Association (SBA) grant of \$21,500, which basically offsets this deficit. The grant doesn't have to be repaid and was obtained through the pandemic-related Paycheck Protection Program (PPP). Offerings may be donated during worship services, via our website, as well as being dropped off in-person at the church office (normally Tues-Thurs between 9:00-1:00, please call first) or by mail to P.O. 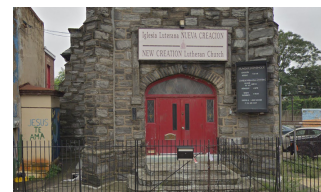

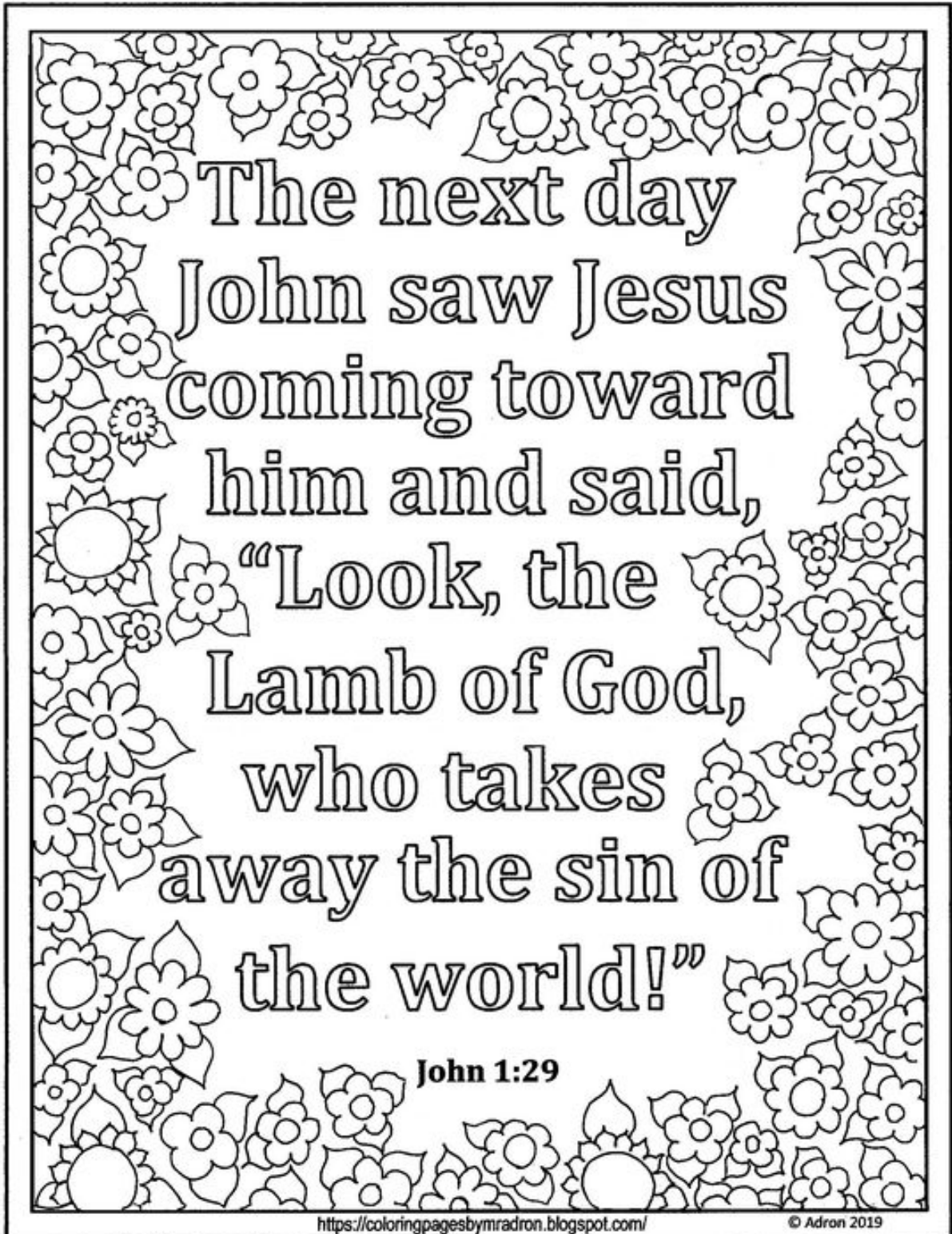
