PASTOR MATT - SUMMER NEWSLETTER 2021

On Sunday September 12th we will go back to two worship services at Advent Lutheran Church. This will please those who miss the traditional or contemporary worship service they enjoy so much. I am looking forward to experiencing our regular worship services essentially for the first time. It is another step of getting back to normal. And as I say that I wonder what the new normal will be. The fact is, there are folks who are not in worship yet because of real health concerns including some our younger members who are not yet able to be vaccinated.

While many aspects of society have gotten back to normal, the pandemic is not yet over. And that is the rub at the moment. There is uncertainty about the future. At this point the world is simply wishing the pandemic to be over... for good... with no more variants. We justifiably want people to stop getting sick and dying. We want the restrictions to be over for everyone. I think wanting to get back to normal is about more than escaping COVID restrictions and the impact of the pandemic. I think it is also about not wanting anymore

surprises or uncertainty. Thinking about the way it was and wanting to go back becomes comforting because there is no uncertainty about the past. When we remember the past there is comfort in knowing what happens next. This makes the past feel less complicated and more idyllic than the present.

There is no going back to the past or getting rid of uncertainty. And this has nothing to do with the pandemic. It is about the nature of reality. What happens next is always uncertain. This does not mean we are stuck with living only with uncertainty. The one thing we can always be certain about is God's love. We can always be certain about the promise of death and resurrection through Jesus Christ. No matter what happens to us, through Christ we are given new life. Through the love of God through his son, Jesus Christ, we no longer need to seek certainty in what happens next. We can trust that no matter what happens, God's love prevails.

In September we go back to two worship services. It is one of many ways we are gradually getting back to normal in our lives and in our society. How will things work out? What will happen next? What will the new normal end up looking like, I do not know. And that is okay. I will take comfort in the love of God and see what happens next.

Our Faith Heals Us

After he was baptized by John the Baptist, Jesus went into the community to do the work of a minister. He reached out to people wherever he went. He noticed some fishermen and chose them as to be his companions and helpers - his disciples. He cared about all people and took special care of those who were lost, sick or troubled. When he saw someone who was ill, he would often summon the Holy Spirit of his baptism to heal that person, right in front of many others who would be there to witness his amazing miracle!

As these people told others about Jesus' power to heal, more people realized that Jesus was truly God's son, and he was the only one on earth who could perform such miracles. They had **faith** in his Godly love and in his ability to bring someone to good health or even revive them from death.

In the Bible, we read in the book of Mark that we can also find the Holy Spirit in those everyday people who believe in Jesus. Most who saw him in-person believed that Jesus was God's son. They trusted him and had faith in him. Those who wanted to be healed tried to get close to him and ask if they could receive a miracle, as others had. It was their faith in Jesus that shone through and directed the Holy Spirit.

Jesus knew he had a bigger mission for God's people. He needed to teach them about God's promise of heaven. He traveled from place to place with his disciples, teaching and telling people he met that they should turn away from sin and have faith in him, the son of God.

Today, we are the ones who believe. We learn from those who lived in Jesus' time by reading about them in the Bible and by praying to God. We know that God is close at all times and is ready to comfort us when we need his gentle hand.

We rejoice that in Christ we find healing – and hope. He is with us and cares for us. When we turn to him in faith for guidance and comfort, he listens and provides meaning in our lives, as he gave up **his** life so that we may find our way to heaven.

THE CHURCH CONSTITUTION

The church constitution guides how our congregation functions according to our faith, theology, and the laws of our society. The constitution of our congregation that was adopted in 1963 was based on a document called “The Model Constitution for Congregations” of our denomination. Down through the years many updates have been made to that model constitution by our denomination. There are many reasons why the updates are made. Many of these updates are intended to make congregations function more effectively. Some of these updates keep the constitution current with changes in federal law. Advent’s constitution has not been updated according to The Model Constitution for Congregations since the congregation was founded.

Some many ask, “We have been fine with our constitution the way it is for all this time, why update it now?” The constitution is like the airbag in your car. You might not think about it day to day as you drive around, but you certainly would not want to drive around without it and you most certainly want it to work well when it does have to work.

Church Council has set up a task force that is working on updating our constitution. Once we have worked out all the updates that need to be made, the constitution and the proposed update will be presented to the congregation with ample opportunity for answers and questions. At the end of the process the congregation will vote as to whether to approve the changes to the constitution. Please look forward to regular communication about the update process. If you have questions or concerns about updating the constitution please contact Ray Heiss, chair of the constitution task force, or Pastor Matt.

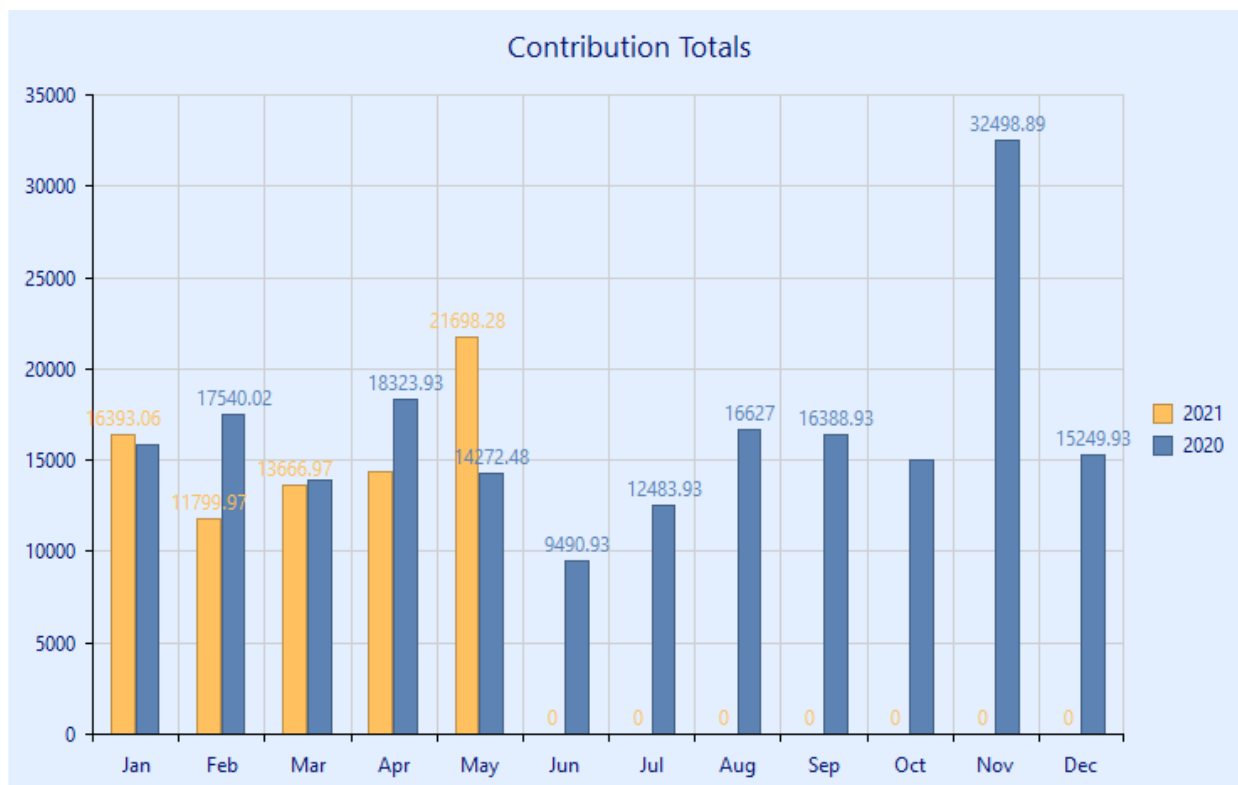
