## PASTOR MATT'S MARCH/APRIL NEWSLETTER 2024

Life lessons can come from unexpected places. As Advent Lutheran does the Book of Acts Bible Study, the first step of our three-year Strategic Mission Plan, I am reminded of one such life lesson from my life.

When I was 14, I had fallen in love with the sport of bicycling. Harry at the Newtown Bicycle Shop gave me a job, and all the guys at the bike shop took me under their wing. They were in their twenties and thirties, and they were my idols. Every Wednesday night group ride that summer, they were teaching me that racing a bicycle is more than just riding one. One important lesson was to ride a straight line. Riding a straight line helps you conserve energy, leaving you 'legs' for the end of the race. As simple as this may sound, it's a whole lot harder than it looks. Each time you push on the pedals, there is a tendency for that force to throw your steering off. A little bit of wobble, just a half inch a yard, adds up quickly as you ride yard after yard, mile after mile, adding more distance to your ride. I remember on one such group ride, Russell, one of the guys from the bike shop, came up beside me and said, "C'mon Matt, ride a straight line. Try to stay on the white line". I tried. I tried riding on the white line along the side of the road. I was looking down at my wheel and I just couldn't stop it from wobbling. The more I focused on it the worse it got. Then I heard the words that made all the difference. "Stop looking down. Instead, look at the white line about ten yards in front of you. Focus on riding to that spot." I focused my eyes about ten yards in front of me and just kept riding to that spot. Russell dropped back and rode behind me, watching me, coaching me.

"Think smooth... 'Don't worry about 'straight.' Just keep riding to that spot." After a while Russell asked, "Do you feel smooth?"

I said, "yes."

Russell said, "Think about how your body feels right now... Do you think you can remember it?" "Yup." "Good, because right now you are riding a perfectly straight line! This is how you practice riding a straight line. With practice you'll keep a straight line without even thinking about it, with or without a white line."

The guys at the bike shop taught me a lot about bicycling that summer. Little did I know, I was learning a lot about life too.

Whether as an individual or as a congregation, it is harder to get to your intended destination looking down instead of up. Yet, a mistake many churches make in trying to move forward is to look down. It is tempting to look at the attendance or finance numbers and try harder with a new quick fix program or ministry. I know Advent Lutheran Church has been frustrated in the past by the ineffectiveness of such 'stare at the wheel' efforts that never seemed to straighten things out. We are instead look forward toward God's love. God's love guides us to where God wants us to be. God's love sustains us and nourishes us, smoothing out the challenges and difficulties we face and making the blessings of life all the sweeter and more exhilarating. The Book of Acts Bible Study now, and doing God Sighting and the worship renewal process this Summer, are all meant focus us on God's actively guiding and sustaining us. This is an important lesson for us as a church and in each of our daily lives. So, stop looking down! Instead, look to God who is right in front of you!




